NE Iowa Synod Ministry Fair

We represented First Lutheran Church, Clarion at the 2024 Northeastern Iowa Synod's first Creative Collaborative Congregations (C3) Ministry Fair held June 1, 2024 at Wartburg College, Waverly, Iowa. We visited displays, attended the worship service, and four workshops.

Enabling Your Congregation To Be Stronger and Your Youth Be Safer

(Rev. Al Erickson and Kathryn Koob) Pastor Erickson said, "God revealed to me two major Biblical mandates missing in my ministry to save kids. First, equip parents and grandparents to pass on the faith and safeguard their children.Luther said that parents are bishops, apostles, and priests. They deserve training. Secondly, all congregational members be prayed for."

Ukraine - Moral Trauma

(Rev. John Sheahan) This presentation highlighted a mission trip to train Ukrainians on Moral Trauma along with teaching the participants as to why we need to continue to support our brothers and sisters of this war-torn country.

Jesus said: You Feed Them. How?

(Rev. Kim and Diane Wills) How do you start and maintain a food ministry? The Wills shared what they have learned from starting a Mobile Food Pantry in 2016 and turned that into a food pantry that owns its own building. They talked about how to source food and the importance of building partnerships.

The Wills represented Zion-St. John, Sheffield. They shared about the community support and faith in God that guided the development of the West Fork

Food Pantry with community volunteers and five congregations. Three things stood out: "We have to be willing to listen to God and to one another. We have to have open and caring hearts. We have to follow Christ, always."

Divina Moments: Many Ways to Listen for God

(Rev. Joy Edeker) Divine reading involves listening for God through prayerful, reflective reading of scripture which involved praying with music, poetry, art/photography, and video.

Lecitio divina, "divine reading," involves listening for God through prayerful, reflective reading of scripture. Pastor Joy Edeker will lead this workshop to help those attending learn about and experience this ancient spiritual practice,

as well as a few creative variations of Lecitio divina that involve music, doodling and artwork. These practices can be incorporated into worship services and midweek evening services during Advent and Lent.

Last year (2023) at the Synod Assembly, it was decided that there will be a Synod Assembly every other year, on the odd years. This year (2024) and in the even years moving forward, there will be Creative Collaborative Congregations (C3) = Ministry Fair. In 2025, there will be a Synod Assembly.

Thank you to our congregation for the opportunity to attend the synod assembly and represent First Lutheran Church of Clarion.



This month in history

Mary, Mother of Our Lord

AUGUST 15—The church honors Mary with the Greek title *theotokos*, meaning "Godbearer." Origen first used this title in the early church, and the councils of Ephesus and Chalcedon upheld it. Luther upheld this same title in his writings. The honor paid to Mary as *theotokos* and mother of our Lord goes back to biblical times, when Mary herself sang, "from now on all generations will call me blessed" (Luke 1:48). Mary's life revealed the presence of God incarnate, and it revealed God's presence among the humble and poor. Mary's song, the Magnificat, speaks of reversals in the reign of God: the mighty are cast down, the lowly are lifted up, the hungry are fed, and the rich are sent away empty-handed.
